### The Overview of the GD method

1. An hour GD about session themes
2. Each GD comprises about 5 people
3. Attendees will be divided into groups at the registration every morning. The grouping will be renewed every day.
4. The group leader per session will be decided by a draw. Once a person is balloted for a leader, the person will not participate in draws any more.
5. The group leader is required to make an effort so that the argument in the GD will be active and smooth. The leader is also required to give a brief summary and comment at the end of the GD.
